Dear Commander Rockwell,

I hope you have received the article I sent you about a fortnight ago, for the new magazine you propose to publish - Colin Jordan told me - I should be grateful if you could let me know whether you received it or not (I sent it registered, but one never knows ---).

I was just now re-reading "The Stormtrooper" of 3-11-1962, with the account of the way you came to our camp - (I was refused admittance into Great Britain this year, did I tell you? An order of the Home Office - without a word of explanation.)

Your account of those splendid days of August 1962, prompted me to translate (from German) and send you a few lines out of the Epilogue of my (yet unprinted) German book "Hart wie Kruppstahl..." In these lines I actually quote one or two sentences of your unforgettable speech.

You can publish the whole extract if you believe it can do any good.

Another point: I should like to tell

² the young man whom you influence brought to National Socialism and "saved from a life of crime" - Mike Sweeney is his pen name - how much I agree with him when he says: "You don't learn to be a National Socialist; you discover that you are one."

I wrote about the self-same words in 1948, (in "Gold in the Furnace") and expressed them in speech countless times between 1929 and 1948 - and since, naturally - I am sending you a copy of "Gold in the Furnace" "The Lightning and the Sun" and of "Pilgrimage" for "Mike Sweeney" - or, would he like me to send them to him directly (if he writes and gives me his address)?

Again another point: as I now cannot go to England freely and have my book "Hard wie Kruppstahl" - "printed here, is there a possibility of printing it in the U.S.A.? I am enclosing the contents of it -
